


Incorporated: 1761

Origin: Granted in 1761, this town bears the name of General Phineas Lyman, an active commander in the Seven Years' War with France and Spain. General Lyman was compensated for his services by grants in Lyman, Grantham, and Lisbon, and 11 towns in what is now Vermont. The original grant recipients included ten others also named Lyman, which probably affected the selection of the town's name. Due to the remote location, settlers experienced difficulties in taking up the claim, and the grant was renewed in 1769. A section of Lyman was taken by legislature in 1854 to form the town of Monroe.

Villages and Place Names: Parker Hill, Tinkerville, Dodge Pond

Population, Year of the First Census Taken: 202 residents in 1790

Population Trends: Population change for Lyman totaled 407 over 54 years, from 201 in 1960 to 608 in 2014. The largest decennial percent change was a 55 percent increase between



1980 and 1990, which followed a 32 percent increase between 1970 and 1980. The 2014 Census estimate for Lyman was 608 residents, which ranked 213th among New Hampshire's incorporated cities and towns.

Population Density and Land Area, 2014 (US Census Bureau): 21.4 persons per square mile of land area, which tied with Wentworth. Lyman contains 28.4 square miles of land area and 0.3 square miles of inland water area.
