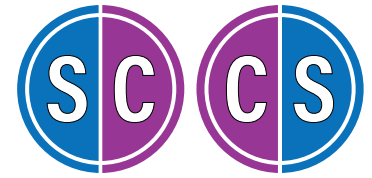


Assistants
