
Center Harbor, NH



Incorporated: 1797

Origin: Center Harbor gets its name from two sources: from its location, centered between Meredith and Moultonborough Harbors, and also for the Senter family, who were owners of a large amount of property in the area. The town was incorporated in 1797 after being separated from New Hampton. Center Harbor was a landing place for lake steamers and stagecoaches, making it a popular summer resort. Center Harbor was a favorite spot of John Greenleaf Whittier, and the home of of Dudley Leavitt, author and publisher of "Leavitt's Farmers Almanac and Miscellaneous Yearbook", starting in 1797.

Villages and Place Names: West Center Harbor

Population, Year of the First Census Taken: 263 residents in 1800

Population Trends: Population change for Center Harbor totaled 499 over 50 years, from 540 in 1970 to 1,039 in 2020. The largest decennial percent

change was a 50 percent increase from 1970 to 1980. The town's population decreased by five percent from 2010 to 2020. The 2022 Census estimate for Center Harbor was 1,040 residents, which ranked 185th among New Hampshire's incorporated cities and towns.

Population Density and Land Area, 2022 (US Census Bureau): 78.0 persons per square mile of land area. Center Harbor contains 13.3 square miles of land area and 2.9 square miles of inland water area.
