

Incorporated: 1767

Origin: Chatham was first granted by the New Hampshire proprietors in 1767, and named in honor of William Pitt, Earl of Chatham and Prime Minister of England. Pitt was one of few who supported the Rockingham government in saying that England had no right to tax the colonists. None of the 73 grantees dared settle in the wilderness, because it was inhabited by the Pequawket. In 1770 the land was granted to new settlers, including Abiel Chandler, founder of the Chandler Scientific School at Dartmouth College, and Samuel Langdon, one time president of Harvard College, who made the famous Blanchard Map of the North Country.

Villages and Place Names: North Chatham, South Chatham

Population, Year of the First Census Taken: 58 residents in 1790

Population Trends: Population change for Chatham totaled 207 over 50 years, from 134 in 1970 to 341 in 2020. The largest decennial percent change was a 41 percent increase from 1970 to 1980, followed by a 42 percent increase from 1980 to 1990. The town's population increased by one percent from 2010 to 2020. The 2022 Census estimate for Chatham was 351 residents, which ranked 223rd among New Hampshire's incorporated cities and towns.

Population Density and Land Area, 2022 (US Census Bureau): 6.2 persons per square mile of land area. Chatham contains 56.7 square miles of land area and 0.5 square miles of inland water area.
