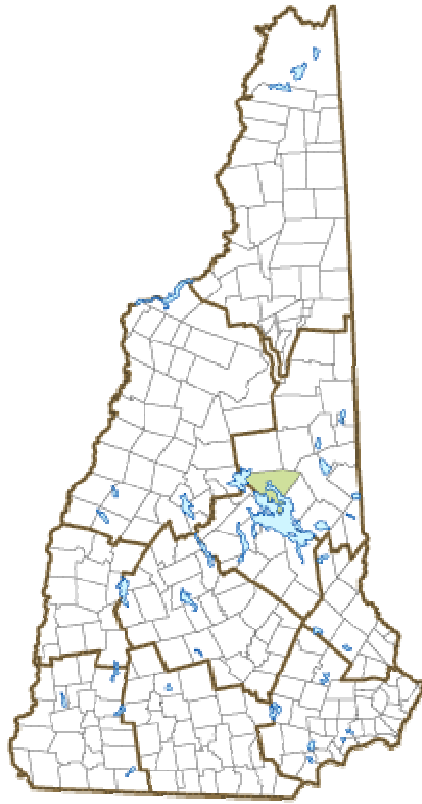

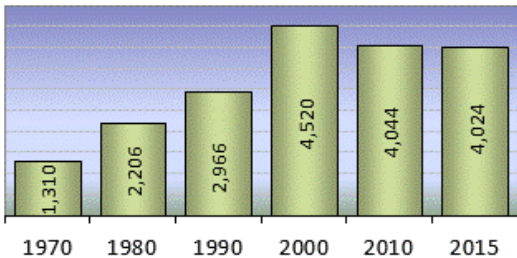
Incorporated: 1777

Origin: This territory was first chartered in 1763, to a group of settlers from Hampton who in 1748 had petitioned the Masonian Proprietors for part of the ungranted lands in the province. The charter describes the boundaries as "running along the northerly shore of Winnepisseoky Pond, and including a neck and point of land running into the pond." Among them were members of the Moulton family, led by Colonel Jonathan Moulton, who was considered to be one of the richest men in the province at the start of the American Revolution. The town was named in honor of Colonel Moulton. In 1765, territory known as Moultonborough Gore was annexed to the town.

Villages and Place Names: Clark Landing, Lees Mill, Moultonborough Falls, State Landing, Winnepesaukee

Population, Year of the First Census Taken: 565 residents in 1790

Population Trends: Population change for Moultonborough totaled 3,184 over 55 years, from 840 in 1960 to 4,024 in 2015. The largest decennial percent change was a 68 percent increase between 1970 and 1980; the second largest was 56 percent between 1960 and 1970. The 2015 Census estimate for Moultonborough was 4,024 residents, which ranked 93rd among New Hampshire's incorporated cities and towns.



Population Density and Land Area, 2015 (US Census Bureau): 67.0 persons per square mile of land area. Moultonborough contains 60.0 square miles of land area and 15.0 square miles of inland water area.
