Women owned nearly one-quarter of all New Hampshire businesses in 1997

New Hampshire share of total businesses lowest in New England

f the 115,747 firms in New Hampshire, women owned 27,265 in 1997, according to the U.S. Census Bureau (see sidebar). More than half of these firms were in Services. This is right in line with the national average. Conversely, Transportation and public utilities claimed the smallest share of women-owned businesses in the state (1.7 percent).

New Hampshire's share of total businesses owned by women (23.6 percent) was the lowest in New England. Massachusetts had the highest share of total firms owned by women (26.6 percent). This was higher than the national average of 26.0 percent.

The U.S. Census Bureas defines a womenowned business as one where women own 51 percent or more of the interest, claims, or rights of that business. Data on women-owned businesses is collected by the U.S. Census Bureau every five years and published in their Economic Census. Their latest publication, the 1997 Economic Census, was published in 2001. Data was compiled from all nonfarm businesses with receipts of \$1,000 or more that filed 1997 tax forms as individual proprietorships, partnerships, or any type of corporation.

firms with paid employees. These 4,205 firms represented just under 14 percent of the total 30,452 firms with paid employees in the state. Rhode Island had the highest share owned by women (15.4 percent). Nationally, women owned 16.0 percent of all firms with paid employees.
