Well Pump Installer

Well Pump Installers maintain and install pumps for water systems. A pump installer license is required to install new pump systems and perform maintenance on existing pump systems. There are two categories of licenses: *domestic* (up to three horsepower), and *commercial*, *industrial*, *and municipal* pump installation (any horsepower).

Licensure Requirements

- Be actively engaged in the trade for a period of three years prior to the date of application, with experience directly related to the type of license issued
- Pass an examination prepared and administered by the Board
- Obtain the appropriate license from the Board

A minimum of two hours of continuing education pertaining to well pumps, water wells, or water conditioning and treatment systems are required annually
