Strafford County Commuting Patterns



County-to-County

- Strafford County had 58,403 employed residents age 16 and over in 2000, up from 52,535 in 1990.
- In 1990 and 2000, roughly three of every five of these residents worked in Strafford County.
- About twice as many people commuted out of Strafford County for work than commuted in for work in 1990 and in 2000.

Commuting Out

Of the Strafford County residents who commuted out of the county for work in 2000, four of every five travelled to another New Hampshire county.

- Most of these residents commuted south to Rockingham County for work in 2000.
- Not surprisingly, our neighboring states of Maine and Massachusetts claimed the vast majority of Strafford County residents who travelled outside of the state for work in 1990 and in 2000.
 - On further examination, the number of workers who travelled to Massachusetts increased by about one-third from 1990 to 2000. The number who commuted to Maine decreased by about the same percent.










Commuting In


- About one-quarter of Strafford County's work force were non-resident commuters in both 1990 and 2000.
- Just over half of the people who commuted to Strafford County for work in 1990 and in 2000 were New Hampshire residents.
 - The majority of these workers lived in Rockingham County.
- Just over 85 percent of the workers who commuted to work in Strafford County from outside the Granite State were Maine residents.

Means of Transportation




- Four of every five Strafford County residents drove themselves to work in 2000, up slightly from 1990.
- Carpooling to work became less popular among Strafford County residents as witnessed by the 24 percent decline from 1990 to 2000.

Travel Time to Work (minutes)



- The number of Strafford County residents who travelled 20 or more minutes to work increased nearly 20 percent from 1990 to 2000. Those who travelled fewer than 20 minutes increased just over two percent.
- Strafford County residents travelled, on average, 24.1 minutes to work in 2000, up 2.6 minutes since 1990.

Time Leaving Home for Work



- Nearly 32,700 Strafford County residents left home for work sometime between 5 am and 8 am in 2000. This was up from 29,800 in 1990.
- Only about 2,050 Strafford County residents chose to leave home for work sometime between midnight and 5 am in 2000. However, this was almost twice the number recorded in 1990.
