

The New Hampshire portion of the Lowell PMSA is unique in that it encompasses only one New Hampshire town, namely Pelham. The rest of the PMSA is made up of Massachusetts communities; one city and nine towns. This section and Table 13.1 summarize Pelham's commuting activities as reported during the census in 1990. The town's estimated residents working numbered 4,853, with 1,015 of those residents staying in Pelham to work. That left 3,838 of the workers to commute out to another community in New Hampshire or out of state. Pelham's total

workforce, residents and nonresidents, numbered 1,882. The nonresident commute-in rate was 46.1% based on 867 incoming workers.

Pelham had a commute-out rate of 79.1%. established by 3,838 resident commuters. Of those, a combined total of 762 workers commuted to the neighboring New Hampshire towns of Nashua, Salem, and Hudson (see Table 13.2). A network of roadways serves Pelham commuters; NH97, NH111A, NH125, and NH128. Almost all out-of-state commuting (99.7%) was directed to Massachusetts, attested by 2,773 Pelham residents having gone to work in the Bay State. Lowell, the Massachusetts city that is part of the PMSA, was the favorite destination of 753 Pelham workers commuting over the border. The State of Maine drew eight Pelham workers during the census sample period.

The same three neighboring New Hampshire towns mentioned above each dispatched more than 50 commuters into Pelham. Derry provided 111 workers to Pelham, thereby joining the list of commute-in towns right at the top. Table 13.3 shows Massachusetts was the only border state to furnish out-of-state commuters (353) to Pelham. Of the list of Massachusetts cities and towns, Lowell and Dracut (part of the PMSA) were the leaders in supplying Pelham with workers.
