for example, may receive up to \$329 a month. In addition to the Montgomery GI Bill, the NH Air Guard offers a 100% Tuition Waiver to NH state schools on a space available basis. This is a great opportunity to further your education at home and achieve your goals with our help. You might also qualify for a cash bonus up to \$20,000. Some Air Guard members are eligible for all these programs. If you are interested in higher education, there is no better way to get it than by enlisting in the Air Guard. After this training is complete, you will return to NH and perform your job one weekend per month and 15 additional days a year.
