Incorporated: 1803

Origin: This town started as the northwest parish of Amherst. Residents of the parish felt that their homes were too far from the courthouse in Amherst, making travel to town meetings very inconvenient. Mont Vernon was incorporated by legislature in 1803. The name was probably in honor of George Washington's Virginia estate, which got its name from Admiral Edward Vernon. George Washington's brother, Lawrence, the original owner of the estate, served under Admiral Vernon as an officer. Although probably not the reason for selecting this name, Admiral Vernon was also a close friend of Governor Wentworth.

Population Trends: Population change for Mont Vernon totaled 1,683 over 50 years, from 906 in 1970 to 2,589 in 2020. The largest decennial percent change was a 59 percent increase from 1970 to 1980. The town's population increased by seven percent from 2010 to 2020. The 2022 Census estimate for Mont Vernon was 2,646 residents, which ranked 120th among New Hampshire's incorporated cities and towns.

Population Density and Land Area, 2022 (US Census Bureau): 157.2 persons per square mile of land area. Mont Vernon contains 16.8 square miles of land area and 0.1 square miles of inland water area.
