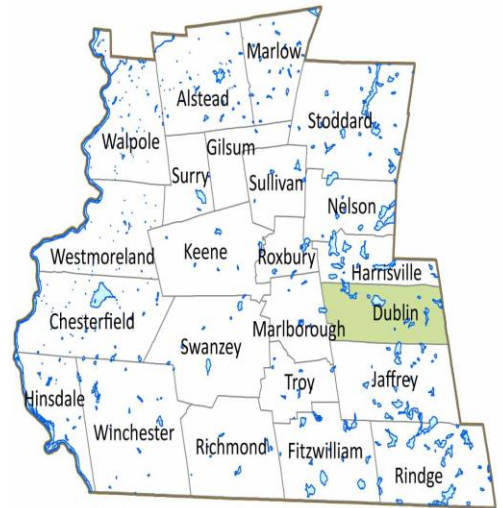
Incorporated: 1771

Origin: This township was first granted by the Masonian Proprietors in 1749 as Monadnock Number 3, or North Monadnock, one of a group of eight towns in the region designated by number. Settlements were made in the 1760s by several from Ireland, who named the township after the Irish capital. In 1771, petition was made for incorporation under the name Dublin, securing the name. Dublin is home to Yankee Publishing, Inc., publishers of well-known magazines such as Yankee and the Old Farmer's Almanac, in publication since 1792.

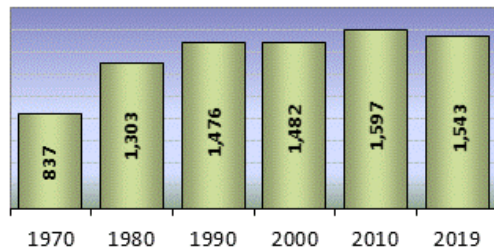
Villages and Place Names: Bonds Corner

Population, Year of the First Census Taken: 901 residents in 1790

Population Trends: Population change for Dublin totaled 706 over 49 years, from 837 in 1970 to 1,543 in 2019. The largest decennial percent change was a 56 percent increase between 1970 and 1980, accounting for over half of the 49-year numeric population change.

The 2019 Census estimate for Dublin was 1,543 residents, which ranked 162nd among New Hampshire's incorporated cities and towns.

Population Density and Land Area, 2019 (US Census Bureau): 55.3 persons per square mile of land area. Dublin contains 28.0 square miles of land area and 1.1 square miles of inland water area.
