Incorporated: 1771

Origin: This township was first granted by the Masonian Proprietors in 1749 as Monadnock Number 3, or North Monadnock, one of a group of eight towns in the region designated by number. Settlements were made in the 1760s by several from Ireland, who named the township after the Irish capital. In 1771, petition was made for incorporation under the name Dublin, securing the name. Dublin is home to Yankee Publishing, Inc., publishers of well-known magazines such as Yankee and the Old Farmer's Almanac, in publication since 1792.

Population, Year of the First Census Taken: 901 residents in 1790

Population Trends: Population change for Dublin totaled 697 over 50 years, from 837 in 1970 to 1,534 in 2020. The largest decennial percent change was

a 56 percent increase from 1970 to 1980. The town's population decreased by four percent from 2010 to 2020. The 2022 Census estimate for

Dublin was 1,573 residents, which ranked 161st among New Hampshire's incorporated cities and towns. Population Density and Land Area, 2022 (US Census Bureau): 56.4 persons per square mile of land area. Dublin contains 28.0 square miles of land area and 1.1 square miles of inland water area.
