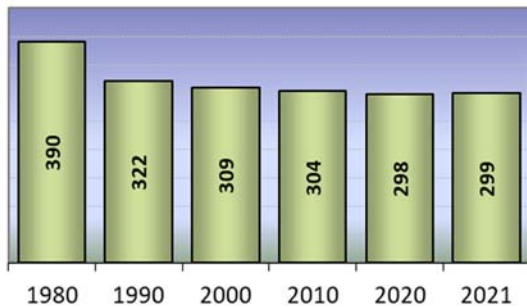

**Incorporated:** 1848

**Origin:** Dummer was named for Governor William Dummer of Massachusetts, whose achievements included a peace treaty with the Indians that lasted nearly twenty years. Also named for Governor Dummer was Fort Dummer, one of the earliest Indian forts in New England, situated near what is now Brattleboro, Vermont; Governor Dummer Academy in Massachusetts, one of the earliest private academies in New England; and the town of Dummerston, Vermont. Although first granted in 1773, Dummer was not incorporated until 1848.

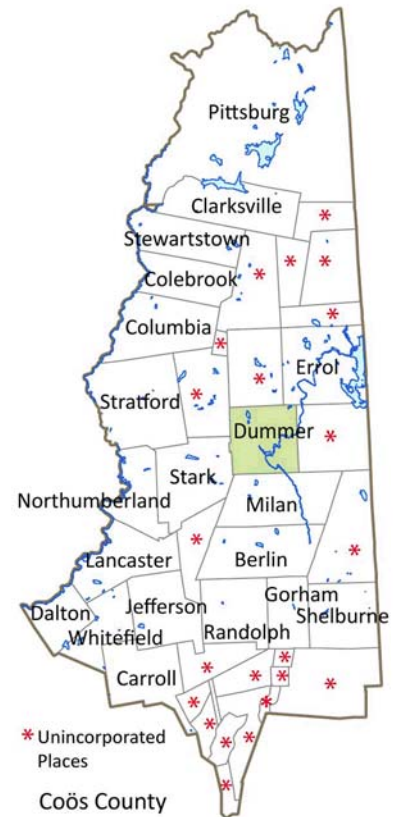
**Villages and Place Names:** Paris

**Population, Year of the First Census Taken:** 7 residents in 1810



**Population Trends:** Population in Dummer decreased by 91 over 41 year, from 390 in 1980 to 299 in 2021. The largest decennial percent change was a 13 percent decline between 1980 and 1990. The 2021 Census estimate for Dummer was 299 residents, which ranked 226th among New Hampshire's incorporated cities and towns, the ninth smallest community.

**Population Density and Land Area, 2021 (US Census Bureau):** 6.2 persons per square mile of land area, the seventh lowest among the cities and towns. Dummer contains 48.0 square miles of land area and 1.3 square miles of inland water area.
