

Incorporated: 1798

Origin: This town started as West Parish, a portion of Rochester that included several large farms. Those farms were separated from Rochester in 1798 as Farmington, a reference to the area's fertile farmland. It was also known as Farmington Dock because its location on the Cocheco River was an ideal spot for sawmills. Those sawmills expanded into shoe-making factories, one of the first places to use automated shoemaking machines instead of handwork. One Farmington resident known in the shoe trade was Jeremiah J. Colbath, who, after changing his name to Henry Wilson, was elected Vice-President under Ulysses S. Grant.

Population, Year of the First Census Taken: 1,029 residents in 1800

Population Trends: Population change for Farmington totaled 3,133 over 50 years, from 3,588 in 1970 to 6,721 in 2020. The largest decennial percent change was a 29 percent increase from 1970 to 1980. The town's population decreased by one percent from 2010 to 2000. The 2022 Census estimate for Farmington was 6,844 residents, which ranked 48th among New Hampshire's incorporated cities and towns.



Population Density and Land Area, 2022 (US Census Bureau): 187.5 persons per square mile of land area. Farmington contains 36.5 square miles of land area and 0.4 square miles of inland water area.
