Incorporated: 1778

Origin: This town was named for Augustus Henry Fitzroy, Duke of Grafton, Earl of Arlington and Euston, Viscount Thetford, and Baron Sudbury. The Duke was a pro-American member of English government prior to the Revolution, and related to Governor Benning Wentworth. Grafton County and Thetford, Vermont, were also named in honor of the Duke. Grantees of the initial 1761 charter voted to surrender their grant in 1762. The land was regranted in 1769 to new colonists, including John Hancock and James Otis, well-known Boston patriots.

Population, Year of the First Census Taken: 403 residents in 1790

**Population Trends:** Population change for Grafton totaled 1,020 over 50 years, from 370 in 1970 to 1,390 in 2020. The largest decennial percent change was a 100 percent increase from 1970 to 1980. The town's population increased by five percent from 2010 to 2020. The 2022 Census estimate for Grafton was 1,414 residents, which ranked 171st among New Hampshire's incorporated cities and towns.



**Population Density and Land Area, 2022** (US Census Bureau): 34.0 persons per square mile of land area. Grafton contains 41.6 square miles of land area and 0.8 square miles of inland water area.
