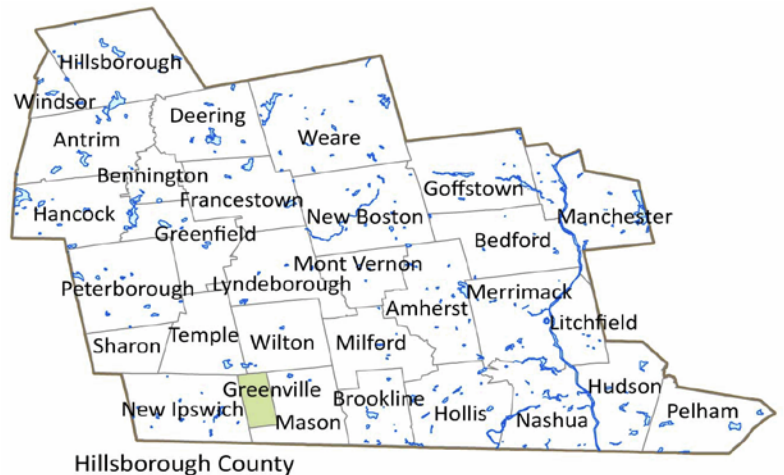
Origin: This town was for many years a part of Mason, which was chartered in 1768. What is now Greenville was alternately known as Slipton, Mason Harbor, and Mason Village. By 1872 it was a prosperous community, its location at the High Falls on the Souhegan River providing access to plentiful water power for the state's first industries. At one time, there were factories making cotton and woolen goods, furniture, shoes, twine, flour, lead pencils, and tinware. Incorporated in 1872, Greenville is the third-youngest town in New Hampshire.

Villages and Place Names: unknown

Population, Year of the First Census Taken: 1,072 residents in 1880

Population Trends: Population change for Greenville totaled 389 residents, from 1,587 in 1970 to 1,976 in 2020. The largest decennial percent change was a 25 percent increase from 1978 to 1980. The town's population decreased by six percent from 2010 to 2020. The 2021 Census estimate for Greenville was 1,971 residents, which ranked 140th among New Hampshire's incorporated cities and towns.

Population Density and Land Area, 2021 (US Census Bureau): 286.5 persons per square mile of land area. Greenville contains 6.9 square miles of land area and 0 square miles of inland water area.
