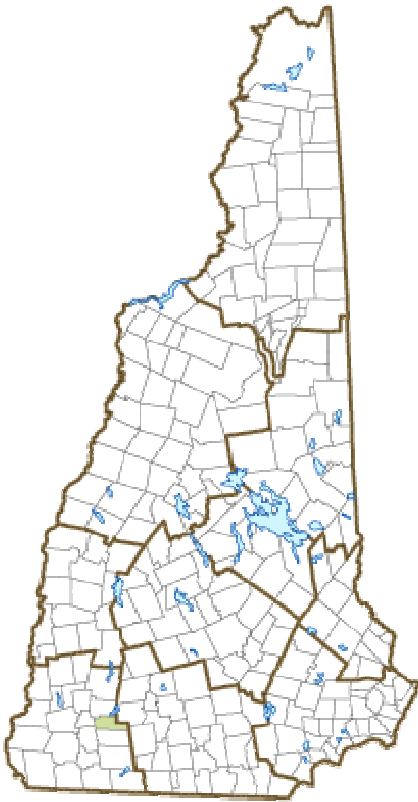

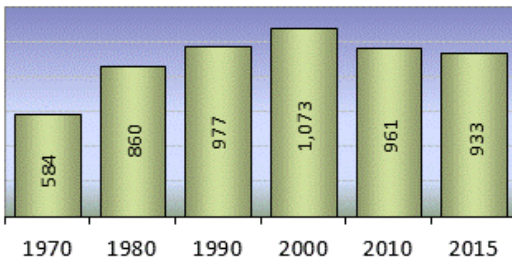

Incorporated: 1870

Origin: First settled in 1760, the town was formed from parts of Hancock, Dublin, Roxbury, Nelson, and Marlborough. The town was first known as Twitchellville, after Abel Twitchell. His daughter Deborah married Bethuel Harris, who with his sons built and operated Harris Mills, one of the first woolen mills in New England. After the business was sold, the name was changed to Cheshire Mills. The town was incorporated in 1871 as Harrisville, at the suggestion of Milan Harris, one of Bethuel's sons and a member of the state senate from 1863-1865. The Harrisville Historic District is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

Population, Year of the First Census Taken: 870 residents in 1880



Population Trends: Population change for Harrisville totaled 474 over 55 years, from 459 in 1960 to 933 in 2015. The largest decennial percent change was a 47 percent increase between 1970 and 1980; the second highest a 27 percent increase between 1960 and 1970. The 2015 Census estimate for Harrisville was 933 residents, which tied with Jefferson, ranking 189th among New Hampshire's incorporated cities and towns.

Population Density and Land Area, 2015 (US Census Bureau): 49.9 persons per square mile of land area. Harrisville contains 18.7 square miles of land area and 1.5 square miles of inland water area.
