
Lyndeborough, NH




Incorporated: 1764

Origin: This territory was first settled in 1735 as Salem-Canada by descendents of soldiers from Salem, Massachusetts, who had fought in New England's first war with Canada in 1690. When the new provincial government in New Hampshire came into being in 1763, a portion of Salem-Canada was regranted to Benjamin Lynde. The town was incorporated as Lyndeborough in 1764. Mr. Lynde was a Harvard classmate of Theodore Atkinson, president of the New Hampshire Governor's Council. He later became chief justice of Massachusetts and presided over the trial involving the Boston Massacre. In the latter part of the 1800s, Lyndeborough was known as a glass-making center.

Population Trends: Population change for Lyndeborough totaled 916 over 50 years, from 789 in 1970 to 1,705 in 2020. The largest decennial percent change was a 36 percent increase from 1970 to 1980. The town's population increased by one percent from 2010 to 2020. The 2022 Census estimate for Lyndeborough was 1,706 residents, which ranked 156th among New Hampshire's incorporated cities and towns.

Population Density and Land Area, 2022 (US Census Bureau): 56.6 persons per square mile of land area. Lyndeborough contains 30.2 square miles of land area and 0.1 square miles of inland water area.
