

towns between Boston and Portsmouth who wished to settle a tract of land north of Exeter. The petitioners asked that the town be named New Boston, but Governor Shute gave it the name Nottingham, in honor of Daniel Finch, second Earl of Nottingham. The Earl was a close friend of Colonial Governors Shute and Dudley of Massachusetts when New Hampshire was under that province's jurisdiction. The original grant was considerably larger than now; Deerfield separated from Nottingham in 1766, and Northwood separated in 1773.

**Population Trends:** Population change for Nottingham totaled 4,278 over 50 years, from 952 in 1970 to 5,230 in 2020. The largest decennial percent change was a 105 percent increase from 1970 to 1980, doubling the population. The town's population increased by nine percent from 2010 to 2020. The 2022 Census estimate for Nottingham was 5,374 residents, which ranked 69th among New Hampshire's incorporated cities and towns.

Population Density and Land Area, 2022 (US Census Bureau): 115.5 persons per square mile of land area. Nottingham contains 46.5 square miles of land area and 1.9 square miles of inland water area.
