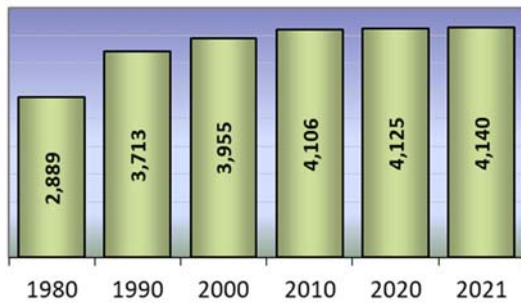
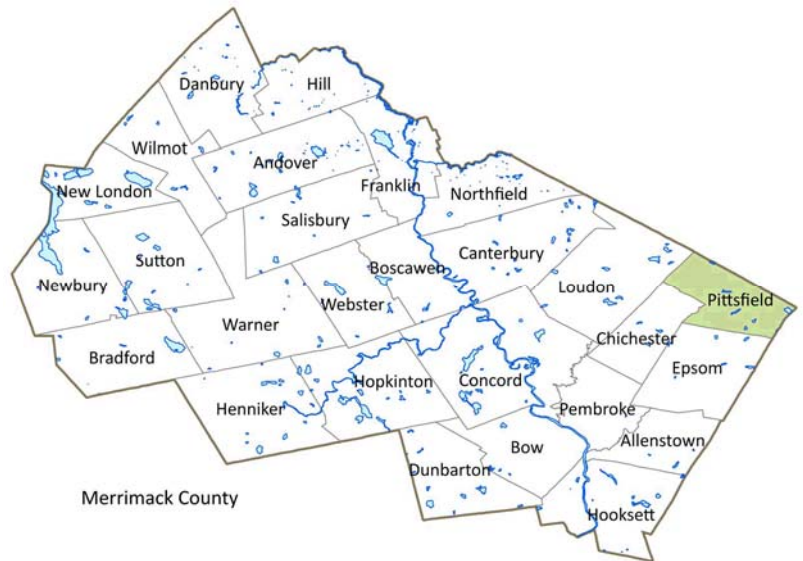

**Incorporated:** 1782

**Origin:** For many years, this territory was the unnamed northern parish of Chichester. In 1782, John Cram, William Chase, and Jonathan Leavitt Jr. petitioned the legislature on behalf of residents for incorporation of a parish separate from Chichester. The petition was granted in March 1782. Like Pittsburg in the north, Pittsfield was named for William Pitt, Prime Minister of England, and a great friend of the Colonies prior to the American Revolution, who had died in 1778. Pittsfield was home to Hiram Americanus Tuttle, Governor of New Hampshire, 1891-1893.

**Villages and Place Names:** Rings Corner, Webster Mills, South Pittsfield

**Population, Year of the First Census Taken:** 888 residents in 1790



**Population Trends:** Population change for Pittsfield totaled 1,251 over 41 years, from 2,889 in 1980 to 4,140 in 2021. The largest decennial percent change was a 29 percent increase between 1980 and 1990. The 2021 Census estimate for Pittsfield was 4,140 residents, which ranked 93rd among New Hampshire's incorporated cities and towns.

**Population Density and Land Area, 2021 (US Census Bureau):** 171.6 persons per square mile of land area. Pittsfield contains 24.1 square miles of land area and 0.2 square miles of inland water area.
