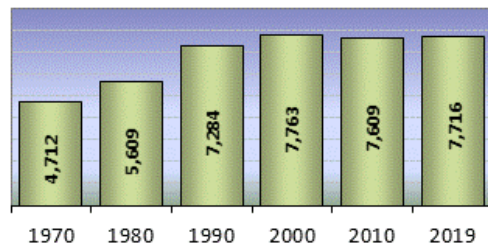
**Incorporated:** 1749

**Origin:** This territory was part of the 1642 land purchase that was Haverhill, Massachusetts. When the New Hampshire-Massachusetts boundary was established in 1741, the portion north of the border became the Haverhill District. The town was incorporated as Plaistow in 1749, and included Atkinson, which was separated in 1767. The spelling was changed later. The name may have come from the English "plaistowe," meaning "an open space or greenwood, near the center of a village where the maypole stood and where sports at holiday times were carried on."

**Villages and Place Names:** Westville

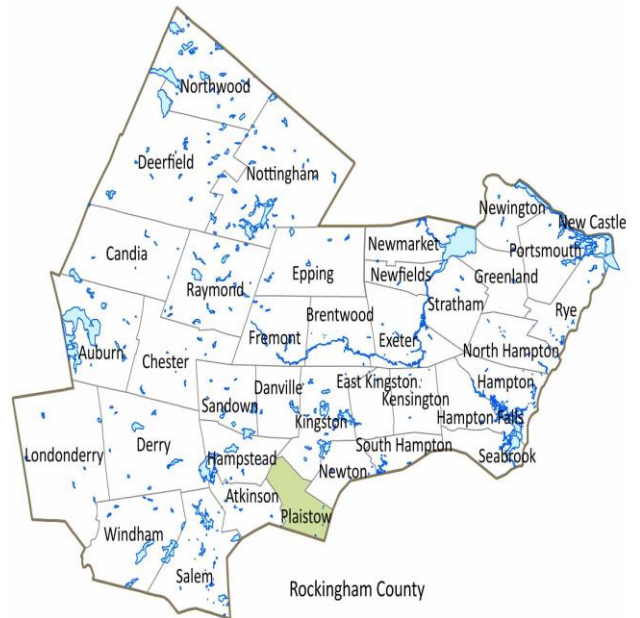
**Population, Year of the First Census Taken:** 521 residents in 1790

**Population Trends:** Population change for Plaistow totaled 3,004 over 49 years, from 4,712 in 1970 to 7,716 in 2019. The largest decennial percent change was a 30 percent increase between 1980 and 1990; the smallest, a seven percent increase between 1990 and 2000. The 2019



Census estimate for Plaistow was 7,716 residents, which ranked 40th among New Hampshire's incorporated cities and towns.

**Population Density and Land Area, 2019 (US Census Bureau):** 727.2 persons per square mile of land area. Plaistow contains 10.6 square miles of land area and 0 square miles of inland water area.
