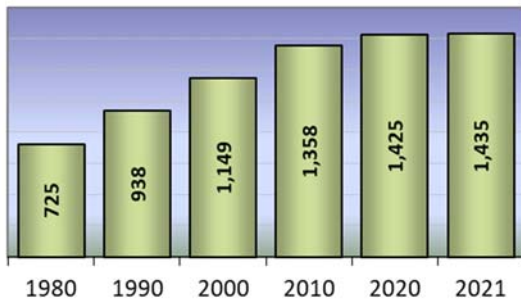
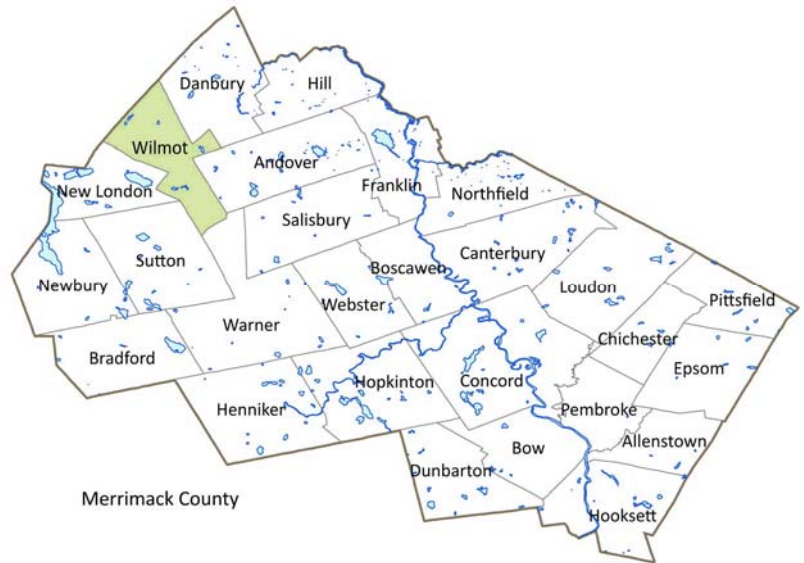

**Incorporated: 1807**

**Origin:** Most of this territory was originally part of a 1775 grant to Jonas Minot, Matthew Thornton, and others that became New London. The town was formed from part of New London and Kearsarge Gore, and incorporated in 1807. The name Wilmot was in honor of Dr. James Wilmot, a scholar and clergyman, and rector at Barton-on-Heath in Warwickshire, England. Though he never came to America, Dr. Wilmot had joined with William Pitt, the Marquis of Rockingham, and others in protesting the treatment of the American colonies by the British crown.

**Villages and Place Names:** North Wilmot, Wilmot Flat

**Population, Year of the First Census Taken:** 423 residents in 1810



**Population Trends:** Population change for Wilmot totaled 710 over 41 years, from 725 in 1980 to 1,435 in 2021. The largest decennial percent change was a 29 percent increase between 1980 and 1990. The 2021 Census estimate for Wilmot was 1,435 residents, which ranked 169th among New Hampshire's incorporated cities and towns.

**Population Density and Land Area, 2021 (US Census Bureau):** 48.8 persons per square mile of land area. Wilmot contains 29.4 square miles of land area and 0.2 square miles of inland water area.
