New Hampshire Occupational Employment & Wages 2010

According to the latest Occupational Employment Statistics estimates, New Hampshire workers earned, on average, \$21.36 per hour in June 2010. Average wages ranged from \$10.77 per hour for workers in Food Preparation and Serving-Related occupations to \$50.71 per hour for workers in Management occupations.

Based on a semi-annual survey, employment and wage rates for workers in all nonfarm industries are collected and estimated for over 600 different occupations. The publication includes employment estimates and entry level, average, median, and experienced wage rates for occupations statewide and in 16 sub-state regions.

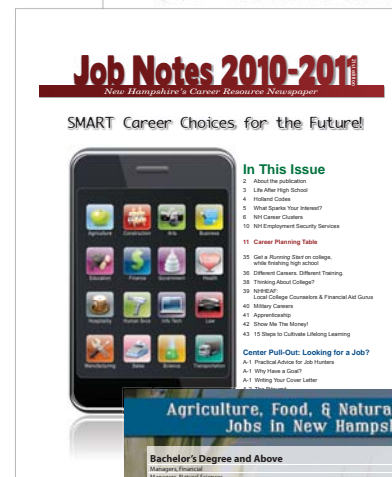
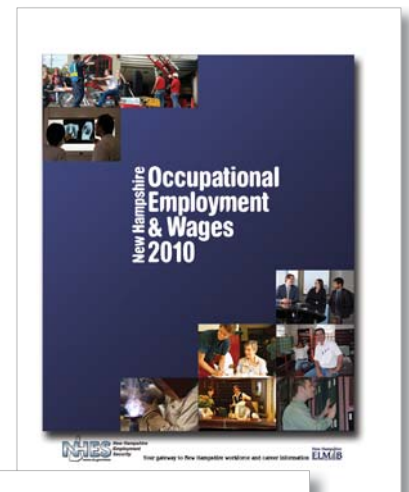
Career Posters
