


- In 2022, an average of 69,946 workers were employed in the manufacturing sector, the third largest number of workers among all industries.
 - Only two sectors employed more workers: health care and social assistance with 92,146 workers, and retail trade with 89,046 workers.
 - Although manufacturing employment increased in 2022, it remained approximately 1,500 workers below 2019 employment.
- Manufacturing accounted for 11.9 percent of total private (non-government) employment in New Hampshire.
- The 2022 private sector share of manufacturing workers in New Hampshire moved ahead of North Carolina for 16th highest among all states in the U.S. and was higher than the national average of 9.9 percent.
- Manufacturing workers were paid an average of \$1,248 per week in 2022.¹ The average weekly wage for all privately employed workers was \$1,103.
 - Manufacturing workers worked an average of 40.1 hours per week in 2022, compared to 33.8 hours for total private employment.
- Of the 40,197 New Hampshire online job ads posted between July and August 2023, 3,394 were for positions in the manufacturing sector.² This accounted for 8.4 percent of total job postings for the period.
 - 269 job ads were for computer and mathematical occupations (eight percent)
 - 507 job ads were for production occupations (15 percent)
 - 414 job ads were for management occupations (12 percent)
 - 419 job ads were for architecture and engineering occupations (12 percent)
 - 315 job ads were for sales and related operations occupations (nine percent)
- Workers in New Hampshire manufacturing sector jobs are less likely to leave their job after hire. The turnover rate in manufacturing, indicating the portion of workers that are new in the industry, was about 59 percent of the rate for workers in all industries.
