It involves both new ways to manufacture existing products, and the manufacture of new products emerging from new advanced technologies."

Advanced Manufacturing Machines

Manufacturing has long been the backbone of the American economy. More recently, "advanced" manufacturing has been in the spotlight. What makes advanced manufacturing different? Companies using advanced manufacturing processes need workers who are capable of operating equipment that is highly technical, automated, computerized — and expensive. Employers are looking for workers with education beyond a high school diploma, as well as some experience in working with machinery.

What are some of the advanced manufacturing jobs in New Hampshire? Though not new occupations, five machine operator occupations that may use advanced manufacturing machinery, and have the best employment prospects for 2010 through 2020, are highlighted below.

Computer-Controlled Machine Tool Operators, Metal and Plastic

These workers operate computer numerical control (CNC) machines or robots to make or refine work pieces made of metal or plastic. There are several types of CNC machines, such as lathes, press brakes, and mill machines.

Extruding and Drawing Machine Setters, Operators, and Tenders, Metal and Plastic

These workers set up, operate, and/or tend machines that extrude or draw thermoplastic or metal materials into tubes, rods, hoses, wire, bars, or structural shapes. These workers may be called extrusion mechanics, wire mill rovers, or jacket line operators.

Grinding, Lapping, Polishing, and Buffing Machine Tool Setters, Operators, and Tenders, Metal and Plastic

Set up, operate, or tend machines to crush, grind, or polish materials, such as coal, glass, grain, stone, food, or rubber. These workers are also known as millers or grinder operators.

Welding, Soldering, and Brazing Machine Setters, Operators, and Tenders

These workers set up, operate, and/

or tend welding, soldering, or brazing machines or robots that weld, braze, solder, or heat treat metal products, components, or assemblies. Workers who operate laser cutters or laser-beam machines are included.

Welders, Cutters, Solderers, and Brazers

Welders use hand-welding, flame-cutting, hand soldering, or brazing equipment to weld or join metal components or to fill holes, indentations, or seams of fabricated metal products. These workers may use welding equipment such as mig welders or sub-arc welders.
