Electrician, Journeyman

Electricians install, repair, alter and maintain electrical conductors, fittings, devices and fixtures for heating, lighting or power purposes. They must comply with the current edition of the National Electric Code. Journeyman Electricians are employed by and perform the above duties under the direction of a Master Electrician. Each Journeyman may directly supervise one Apprentice Electrician until he/she has had the Journeyman license for at least one year, then he/she may directly supervise two Apprentices up to three Journeymen per job site. No more than a total of six master or journeymen per job site may have a second Apprentice to supervise.

- Four years (8,000 hours) of practical experience as an apprentice to a licensed electrician
- Four years of schooling (150 hours per year) in electricity

A 15-hour course on each new edition of the National Electric Code (proof required the first year the code is out)
