

Electrician, Master

Master Electricians perform work as their principal or auxiliary business or as businesses hire; they may employ others to do electrical work. Electricians install, repair, alter, and maintain electrical conductors, fittings, devices, and fixtures for heating, lighting, or power purposes. They must comply with the current edition of the National Electric Code. A master may directly supervise two apprentices; up to a total of six master or journeymen per job site may have a second apprentice to supervise.

Licensure Requirements

- Pass Journeyman's examination
- One year (2,000 hours) of practical experience as a licensed journeyman

Examination

Written examination required through PROV. Exam fee paid to PROV.

Continuing Education

A 15-hour course on each new edition of the National Electric Code (proof required the first year the code is out)

Permitted with Maine, Massachusetts, Vermont
