Land Surveyor

Establish official land boundaries and help determine the value of plots of land. Research deeds, write legal descriptions of land, measure plots of land, and collect information for maps and charts. May head up a survey party, where they are responsible for its activities and the accuracy of its work. Plan fieldwork, select survey reference points, determine the exact location of land features, and prepare survey reports. Select survey staffs, prepare budgets, and buy survey equipment.
