Provide individual, marital, and family counseling to adults and children. Help clients identify personal and interactive problems to achieve personal, marital, and family development and adjustment.

Licensure Requirements

- Master's degree or Doctorate in marriage and family therapy from an accredited program
- Pass national exam of the Association for Marriage and Family Therapy Regulatory Boards
- Complete at least a one-year practicum/ internship supervised by an AAMFT approved supervisor prior to the completion of the master's degree. This experience shall total a minimum of 300 hours of face-to-face client contact hours with individuals, couples, and families for the purpose of assessment, diagnosis and treatment. At least half of these client contact hours shall have been completed with couples and families.
- Must complete a criminal background check

Examination

Applicants for licensure must pass the national examination in marital and family therapy distributed by the American Association of Marital and Family Regulatory Boards.

Continuing Education

Forty continuing education hours (CEUs) every two years, and 40 hours of collaboration every two years
