Water Treatment Plant Operator

Responsible for the purification processes of water to be used as public water supplies. Meter chemicals into water based on analytical testing and continuous monitoring to produce a safe, aesthetically pleasing water. Test samples of water throughout the process and record results to assure water quality. Certified operators are required for community (residential) and non-transient, non-community (such as schools and workplaces) public water systems.
