EMPLOYMENT BY INDUSTRY

Employment Trends, 2016 - 2021


The coronavirus pandemic and resulting recession ended more than ten years of economic growth, the longest period of economic growth in U.S. history. Prior to the pandemic, total nonfarm payroll in New Hampshire had increased slowly but steadily.¹ Total nonfarm employment increased from 665,600 jobs in 2016 to 684,000 in 2019, an increase of 2.8 percent. The pandemic caused a sharp decline in employment, beginning in March 2020. Total nonfarm employment averaged 639,400 jobs in 2020, although at its lowest point (April 2020) employment fell to 569,300 jobs. Employment increased again starting in May 2020, and nonfarm employment increased through the end of 2021. In December 2021, total nonfarm employment was 675,500 jobs, 2.6 percent (17,800 jobs) below December 2019 nonfarm employment.

From 2016 to 2019, employment in goods producing industries (construction, manufacturing, and mining and logging) increased at a faster rate than service-providing industries. Employment in goods producing industries, which account for approximately 15 percent of total nonfarm employment, increased 5.9 percent between 2016 and 2019, while service-providing industry employment increased 2.2 percent.

Employment in goods producing industries fell 4.1 percent in 2020, while employment in serviceproviding industries fell 6.9 percent.² However, service-providing industry employment increased at a faster rate in 2021, growing 4.1 percent while goods producing industry employment grew 1.5 percent.

Although employment in service-providing industries grew faster, this was likely because services employment had declined further in 2020. In total, goods producing industry employment fell 2.7 percent from 2019 to 2021, while serviceproviding industry employment fell 3.1 percent.

Among goods producing industries, construction experienced the fastest employment growth, both before and during the pandemic. From 2016 to 2019, construction employment increased 9.4 percent, nearly double the 4.8 percent increase in manufacturing employment. Construction



employment did not decline in 2020, while manufacturing employment, which had declined slightly in the second half of 2019, fell 5.9 percent. While construction employment increased 3.9 percent in 2021, manufacturing employment increased just 0.4 percent. Mining and logging employment remained essentially unchanged from 2016 through 2021.

1 Total nonfarm payroll measures employment by place of work. It does not include self-employed, unpaid family members, or agricultural workers.

2 Annual employment estimates are an average of employment for all 12 months during the year. In 2020, this averages several large month-to-month employment changes during the early months of the pandemic. The annual average evens out the peaks and troughs of early pandemic employment. For most industries, employment fell well below the annual average during the early months of the pandemic, then increased throughout the rest of the year. Prior to the pandemic, arts, entertainment, and recreation was the fastest growing serviceproviding industry, with employment increasing 11.2 percent between 2016 and 2019. In 2020, employment declined 27 percent, as arts, entertainment, and recreation was one of the industries hardest hit by the pandemic. Although it increased 17.0 percent in 2021, arts, entertainment, and recreation employment remained below 5.2 percent below 2016 levels.

Transportation and warehousing and professional, scientific, and technical services both experienced above-average growth prior to the pandemic, and while employment in service-providing industries

overall declined 6.9 percent in 2020, annual employment in these industries did not decline. Transportation and warehousing and professional, scientific, and technical services employment increased in 2021 as well; in total, employment in these industries increased 14 and 16 percent, respectively, from 2016 to 2021.

Although it fell slightly from 2016 to 2019, finance and insurance employment increased slightly in 2020. Employment increased 0.4 percent, followed by a 2.2 percent increase in 2021. Overall, finance and insurance employment increased 0.7 percent from 2016 to 2021. Retail trade employment also declined from 2016 to 2019, falling 2.0 percent.

Retail employment declined 5.5 percent in 2020, before increasing 2.6 percent in 2021. Retail employment fell 5.0 percent from 2016 to 2021.


Comparison to Regional and National **Employment Growth**

Before the pandemic, total nonfarm employment in New Hampshire, and New England in general, grew at a slower rate than overall U.S. employment growth. In 2020, employment in New Hampshire fell 6.5 percent, further than U.S. employment, which declined 5.8 percent. However, employment in New Hampshire did not fall as far as the New England region overall, which saw employment decline 7.8 percent. Only Maine,

which had an employment decline of 6.1 percent, lost a smaller percentage of jobs than New Hampshire in 2020.

After falling further than U.S. employment in 2020, employment in New England grew at a faster rate in 2021, 3.4 percent, compared to a national average of 2.8 percent. New Hampshire exceeded the New England average, with 3.7 percent growth. Service-providing industries, particularly the financial activities, professional and business services, and leisure and hospitality supersectors, were responsible for New Hampshire's above average employment growth.
